



## Knowledge Transfer Partnership grant (KTP)

- A three-way partnership providing
- Expertise to innovate
  - Match your challenge to expertise from over 100 Knowledge Bases
- Funding to enable
  - Innovate UK will provide between 50-75% of project funding
- Resource to deliver transformational positive change
  - This change can be economic, societal and environmental

Steps and Timescales to getting started on your KTP project

Explore company ideas / Link to relevant academics

Develop a Fact Find Form / KTP Adviser Meeting

Develop Application/workplan with lots of support from us and your partner

Target submission deadline - every 2 months

Next two December 4<sup>th</sup> 2024 & February 5<sup>th</sup> 2025

KTP Assessment Process – 8-10 weeks

Recruit KTP Associate (9 months allowance) ~4-6 months average

Project Delivery - 1-3 years
Projects starts as soon as Associate recruited above



## Why partner with UEA?


- What method would produce the greatest member benefit?

## Scoping out the project

- Data sharing
- What are AF Group challenges and ambitions?
- What expertise can UEA bring?
- Is KTP the right vehicle?
- No mini-project but other KTPs have benefitted from EIRA Innovation vouchers/ UEA's KE+ Fund



#### A long process . . .

2 years from initial conversations to starting the KTP application.

1 year from starting the KTP application to the KTP project starting.

A lot of work - a lot of time taken to scope and define the project, ensuring it had clear and tangible outcomes and worthy of funding.

Getting the narrative, business case and commercial impacts right takes several iterations.

#### Recruitment

University recruitment timelines can be long (although UEA has introduced efficiencies and new systems in 2023).

180 applications made shortlisting challenging!

Shout about the opportunities available to the candidate because of the KTP.

## Top tips for businesses considering KTP



The AF Group & UEA KTP Team

- It is a process dedicated the time to it it's worth it!
- Senior management buy-in is crucial
- Make sure your business case is strong for a good chance of success
- Try a mini-project first, i.e. KE+
- Dedicate resources to support KTP
- Leverage expertise of your KTP Advisor
- Spend time on a detailed job and project specification to attract the right candiates
- Don't be turned off by cost it's extremely good value!
- Use the partnership to tap into other knowledge at the University
