What is a National Contact Point (NCP)?

The network of **National Contact Points in the UK** and **other countries** provide free guidance, practical information and assistance on all aspects of participation in Horizon Europe.

NCP services vary in each country/sector, but typically include:



Informing and awareness raising

on Horizon Europe and other EU programmes



Assisting, advising and training

to improve the quality of Horizon Europe proposals



Signposting and cooperation

highlighting support avail. & supporting consortium development

British Academy Horizon Europe Pump Priming

(Reopened on 12 Nov 24. Deadlines 4 Dec, then if money left 4 Jan, 12 Feb, 5 March)

- Projects have to be led by an eligible Principals Investigator (PI)
- "Proposals are encouraged and welcomed that involve working closely with any type of organisation eligible for Horizon Europe funding (based in the UK and/or the EU/Associated Countries), including SMEs, third parties, end users and similar bodies/organisations such as hospitals, libraries, regulators, commercial partners, creative industry partners, museums, local authorities and associations, NGOs, charities and companies as appropriate to the selected Call and Topic."
- Up to £10,000

Other:

- IUK Business Growth is part of the <u>Enterprise Europe Network (EEN)</u>
- Other UK Help and Support including the UKRO UK Research Office

Horizon Europe Introduction

What is Horizon Europe?

Horizon Europe is the EU's Research and Innovation funding programme and runs calls from 2021 until 2027

It is the largest international R&I funding programme with a budget of €95.5 billion*

The UK has Associated to Horizon Europe, which means that UK researchers and innovators can fully participate in Horizon Europe** (including leading projects)



- Horizon Europe funds all types of organisation (including academia, SMEs, large companies and others)
- It funds all Research & Innovation (R&I) sectors
 - some calls specify the R&I to be done
 - other calls leave that up to the applicants to decide



^{*} Plus Associated Country contributions. Associated Countries have signed an agreement with the EU which means that organisations from the Associated Country can receive Horizon Europe funding, and can take part in and lead projects.
** Only exceptions:

Types of Organisation

Unless stated otherwise in the call text:

All types of organisation can participate in Horizon Europe proposals and projects including

- academia
- industry of any size,
- Research and Technology Organisations (RTOs)
- governments,
- · charities,
- regulators, patient groups, hospitals and any other type of organisation.

All types of organisation can access funding as long as they come from a country which is eligible for Horizon Europe funding (shown in green on the previous slide).

If an organisation does not come from a country eligible for funding, then they can participate but normally must bring their own funding.





Why Participate?

- Access to funding
- Solve global challenges through collaborative research and development generating world leading expertise and innovation, resulting in new UK growth opportunities and jobs.
- Benefit from cutting edge European and global research, technologies, infrastructure, talent
- Gain access to and collaborate with supply and value chains within Europe and globally
- Influence standards, regulations, and policies, paving the way for UK expertise and solutions to be applied globally





Horizon Europe – Pillar II - Clusters



- Challenge driven must solve the problem posed by the European Commission (so not bottom-up idea driven)
- Each cluster has a document called a 'Work Programme'.
 It lists specific call topics, and each call topic has a recommended
 - Scope
 - Expected outcomes (impact)
 - Budget
- All of the call topics in the 2024 Health Work Programmes have closed.
- The 2025 call topics are currently expected to be published ~mid April 2025
- Mainly funds consortium projects with at least 3 different legal entities from 3 different Member States and/or Associated Countries.
 At least one organisation must be from an EU Member State.
- Consortium partners often very varied –you should have the right people for the tasks and from any type of legal entity
- Project size for each varies from less than €1m to a few million
- Typical duration?

Work Programme 2023-2024 General Annexes (from p13 and p32). Check Updated 2025 version once available

Research and innovation actions (RIA)

- Activities aiming primarily to establish new knowledge or to explore the feasibility of a new or improved technology, product, process, service or solution.
- May include basic and applied research, technology development and integration, testing, demonstration and validation on a small-scale prototype in a laboratory or simulated environment.

Innovation actions (IA)

- Activities directly aimed at producing plans and arrangements or designs for new, altered or improved products, processes or services
- Possibly including prototyping, testing, demonstrating, piloting, large-scale product validation and market replication.

Coordination and support actions (CSA)

 Activities contributing to the objectives of the Horizon Europe Programme, excluding R&I activities (with some rare exceptions – see the General Annexes to the Work Programme)

Pre-commercial procurement actions (PCP) – None in 2025 Health Draft Work Programme
Public procurement of innovative solutions actions (PPI) – None in 2025 Health Draft Work Programme
Programme Co-fund Actions (COFUND) – Unlikely to be suitable for you. Please seek NCP advice.

Main Types of Project

- RIA all participants receive 100% of (eligible direct costs + indirect costs at flat rate of 25% of direct costs*). Page limit usually 45 pages
- IA for profit participants receive **70%** of (eligible direct costs + indirect costs at flat rate of 25% of direct costs*). Page limit usually 45 pages non-profit organisations receive **100%** of (eligible direct costs + indirect costs at flat rate of 25% of direct costs*).
- CSA all participants receive 100% of (eligible direct costs + indirect costs at flat rate of 25% of direct costs*). Page limit usually 30 pages

*indirect costs are a flat rate of 25% of the (total eligible direct costs, excluding eligible direct costs for subcontracting, financial support to third parties and any unit costs or lump sums which include indirect costs)

Consortia Size - Actual

Statistics on actual consortia size (excluding IHI):

Societal Challenge 1 on "Health; Demographic Change and Well-being" of the previous EU R&I programme, Horizon 2020 (2014-2020):

> 80% of RIAs had between 7 to 18 participants (13 in average)

> 613 projects (RIAs) involving 8143 participants:
from EU Member States (87%), H2020 Associated Countries other Third Countries (6%)

> Type of organisations: Higher or Secondary Education Establishments (42%), Private for-profit entities (23%), Research Organisations (23%), Public bodies (6%), Other (6%).







Horizon Europe Pillar II - Evaluation



Evaluation Criteria in Horizon Europe*

Work Programme 2023-2024 General Annexes (from p23) Check Updated 2025 version once available

- Weighted equally for:
 - Research and Innovation Actions (RIAs)
 - Coordination and Support Actions (CSAs)
- Impact weighted at 1.5 for Innovation Actions (IAs)
- Scored 1-5
- Thresholds:
 - Often 4/5 for each criteria
 - Often 12/15 overall
- Two-stage calls: Excellence and Impact only, threshold at first stage normally 8 or 8.5







Priority Order for Proposals with the Same Score

In the absence of special arrangements in the specific call/topic conditions, the following method will apply for each group of proposals with the same score

- 1) Proposals that address aspects of the call that have not otherwise been covered by more highly ranked proposals
- 2) The proposals identified under 1), if any, will themselves be prioritised according to the scores they have been awarded for 'Excellence'. When these scores are equal, priority will be based on scores for 'Impact'. In the case of 'Innovation actions', priority will be given to the score for 'Impact', followed by that for 'Excellence'.
- 3) If necessary, the gender balance among the researchers named in the researchers table
- 4) If necessary, any further prioritisation will be based on geographical diversity, defined as the number of Member States or Associated Countries represented in the proposal, not otherwise receiving funds from projects higher up the ranking list (and if equal in number, then by budget).
- 5) If a distinction still cannot be made, the panel may decide to further prioritise by considering other factors related to the objectives of the call, or to Horizon Europe in general. These may include, for example, enhancing the quality of the project portfolio through synergies between projects or, where relevant and feasible, involving SMEs.

What is a Horizon Europe 'Mission'?

• A mission is a portfolio of activities intended to achieve a **bold**, **inspirational and measurable goal within a set timeframe**, **with impact for society and policy making** as well as relevance for a significant part of the European population and a wide range of Europe citizens.

Goal of Cancer Mission

• Improve the lives of more than 3 million people by 2030, through prevention, cure and for those affected by cancer including their families, to live longer and better (jointly with Europe's Beating Cancer Plan)

Horizon Europe Health - Partnerships

- European partnerships bring together the European Commission and private and/or public partners together to tackle pressing challenges.
- Most partnerships run calls for proposals
 - Each partnership has different rules on which countries and types of organisation can be funded
 - This can change call by call, so please read the call text to check if you are eligible for funding
 - Most partnerships do NOT use standard Horizon Europe eligibility rules!
- There are 10 different partnerships in the Horizon Europe Pillar 2 Health Cluster

Horizon Europe Health - Partnerships - IHI

Innovative Health Initiative (IHI)

{successor to the <u>Innovative Medicines Initiative</u> (IMI) but broadened to include prevention, diagnostics, treatment and disease management incl. Pharma, Biotech, MedTech, Vaccines, Radiological, Electromedical and the Healthcare IT Industry.

EU partnership in health between:

- the **European Union** represented by the European Commission and
- the Healthcare industry associations:
 - COCIR (medical imaging, radiotherapy, health ICT and electromedical industries)
 - EFPIA, including Vaccines Europe (pharmaceutical and vaccine industries)
 - EuropaBio (biotechnology industry)
 - MedTech Europe (medical technology industry)

UK organisations are eligible for IHI funding, but check the call text for other eligibility rules:

- UK universities, SMEs, charities and the NHS should always be eligible for IHI funding
- For IHI two stage calls, large companies are not normally eligible for funding








Diagram from IHI Presentation on Call 9 on 15 Jan 2025





Why also look outside the Health Cluster for funding?

- In Horizon 2020 (the EU's Research and Innovation Programme 2014-2020)
 - 29% of projects including Health and Medical Sciences were funded in the Health Challenge
 - 71% of projects including Health and Medical Sciences were funded outside of the Health Challenge
- Where you apply may depend on your R&I idea, and on what kind of project you want to do
- In Horizon Europe there are different opportunities across the programme, for example
 - Some calls have 'top-down' prescribed R&I areas you need to do exactly what the Commission wants, and your idea might not fit in! (e.g. Pillar 2 incl. Health Cluster, Cancer Mission, Partnerships)
 - Some calls are open to all R&I areas (e.g. the ERC, MSCAs, COST and some EIC calls)
 - Some calls do not require a consortium (e.g. ERC, MSCA fellowships, some EIC calls)
 - Some calls fund networking (e.g. MSCA Staff Exchange Scheme and COST)

Framework Programmes

- Framework Programmes are the European Commission's (EC) funding programmes for Research and Innovation.
- Horizon Europe is the 9th Framework Programme (FP).
- FP's began in 1984 with a budget of €3 billion.
- The current FP Horizon Europe began in 2021 and will end in 2027. The budget over the 7 years will be ~€95.5 billion.
- FP10 will begin in 2028.
 - <u>UK position paper</u>: "...the UK will be interested in potentially associating to FP10, assuming it is open, relevant, and provides good value for researchers and taxpayers."

What does this mean?

- UK organisations can apply for Horizon Europe* funding, from now (2024 onwards) with certainty, that if successful, they will be funded by the European Commission.
- UK organisations can now lead consortia (again).
- If you applied to a call which was not covered by UK Association you will still be covered by the UK Government's Horizon Guarantee for the duration of the projects (for calls dated 2021, 2022, and 2023).

- Governments
- Charities
- Cultural Institutions, and others...

All types of organisation can access funding as long as they come from a country which is eligible for Horizon Europe funding.* Please see Work Programme General Annexes for rules about China, Russia, Belarus and parts of Ukraine (pages7-8).

If an organisation does not come from an eligible country, they can participate but normally must bring their own funding.

 - Must include at least 1 Member State (the MS does not have to lead)
- Consortium partners often very varied
 - it's about having the right people for the task, and from any type of legal entity
- Projects last between **2-5 years** (on average)



The framework developed by ECHOES will be key for future EU ECCCH funding.

ECHOES will also directly influence the development of digital opportunities via a cascading grants programme

- Three calls Feb 2025, Sept 2025, Sept 2026
- 50 projects to be funded of up to c.€60,000 each
- Aim to bring data and applications into the ECCCH and stimulate collaboration between researchers, CHIs, and ECCCH

- E.g. searching for 'Culture, creativity and inclusive society gender discrimination' returns 6 projects
- 1st project listed is <u>RE-WIRING</u>: project proposed a 3-dimention approach to enable the identification of root causes of gender hierarchies and aims to 're-wire' political, cultural and economic institutions.
- Gives project coordinator as UNIVERSITEIT UTRECHT (Netherlands) and gives the opportunity to contact them and their partners.
- Contact is to the Project Participant, not just a central administrative function.
- Write them a note explaining what you want/intend to do and how their participation would be a great idea
- If the project has a UK partner, contact your NCP in case they know the team.



Update on the UK's Association Agreement

- On 7th September 2023, the UK's Prime Minister announced a new UK-EU agreement on the UK's association to Horizon Europe and Copernicus.
- As of 1st January 2024, the United Kingdom has become an associated country to Horizon Europe.
- UK applicants are eligible to apply to Horizon Europe calls, now and in the future. The government strongly encourages researchers/innovators to do so.
- All calls within the Horizon Europe work programme 2024 and beyond are covered by the UK's association to Horizon Europe with European Commission funds.
- The UK government Horizon Europe guarantee has been extended to cover all remaining Horizon
 Europe grant calls that are funded under work programme 2023 irrespective of the call closing or grant
 signature date.







Funding rates and main types of Action

Research and Innovation Action (RIA)

- Typically, low(ish) Technology Readiness Level.
- Consortium of at least three different legal entities from three different eligible countries (all UK legal entities are classed as eligible). At least one consortium member must be from a Member State (MS).
- All participants receive 100% of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs.

Innovation Action (IA)

- Typically, high(er) Technology Readiness Level.
- Consortium of at least three different legal entities from three different eligible countries. At least one must be from a MS.
- All not-for-profit participants receive 100% of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs.
- All for-profit participants receive 70% (60% if co-programmed partnerships) of eligible direct costs plus 25% for indirect costs.

Coordination and Support Action (CSA)

- As name suggests, for coordinating and supporting activities such as working groups, networking, regulation review, communications, organising EU conferences, etc.
- Formally do not need a collaborative approach but often do to meet the scope. Must have at least one partner from a MS.







Orientations cover expected impacts and outcomes which I can help you understand better in the lead up to your application.

The UK's Performance (2021-2024)

- The UK is the #1 Associated Country within Cluster 4: Industry.
- The UK's average Cluster 4: Industry success rate (2021-2024) across relevant Destinations is 16.13% which is just above the overall Horizon Europe success rate of 15-16%.
- Total UK eligible participations = 1331 of which SMEs = 381.
- Total UK winners = 222 of which SMEs = 82.
- Total funding awarded to UK winners:
 - 2021-2023 = £61.88 million, through the UK Horizon Europe Guarantee

Partnerships in Horizon Europe

- There are three types of Partnership in Horizon Europe:
 - **Joint Undertakings** (also called Institutional Partnerships) are a Joint Undertaking between the EC and the 'Private Members'. JUs were created by legislation (called the <u>Single Basic Act</u>) and are legal entities in their own rights. They write their own calls for proposals and do not report to the Programme Committee. They have SRG instead. Calls for proposals are done on the main EC website and then they then manage the delivery of the funded projects themselves.
 - Co-Programmed Partnerships are associations with members from 'the sector' (almost anyone can join) who together with the EC write the Work Programme (WP) for their part of the programme. This is then included in the regular WP for the Programme Committee to review. It is then just part of the WP like any other part and the partnership has no further role
 - Co-Funded Partnerships are when the EC and national funding bodies (such as UKRI and equivalents from other countries) both put funding in to create a new programme that then itself holds competitions for funding. The creation of a co-funded partnership begins with a call for proposals in the WP that the national funding bodies come together to write a proposal for. Only organisations from countries who contribute financially to the partnership can participate in subsequent competitions

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Top Tip – if there is a <u>co-programmed</u> <u>partnership</u> in your sector, I strongly recommend you consider joining






